
REPORTING PERIOD: NOVEMBER 2020

TRIAGE:

Every beneficiary that calls the clinic is asked a few questions by the social worker (i.e. triaged) to better gather basic demographic information, understand the reason for which they seek services, and therefore help them make a decision regarding the services that they need. The triage number represents the number of people who called who could *potentially* become beneficiaries. The outcome of the triage represents the decision taken by the social worker, after the information was gathered from the potential beneficiary.



GROUP CONSULTATIONS INFORMATION:

4 beneficiaries came in for group sessions in November 2020. All 4 of them had already visited an Embrace psychologist/psychiatrist/psychologist-in-training for an individual session prior to coming in for a group session.

INDIVIDUAL CONSULTATIONS INFORMATION:


Of the 204 individual consultations, 28% were first appointments, and the remaining 72% were follow ups. On average, beneficiaries came in for 3.17 individual sessions in November.

BENEFICIARY DISENGAGEMENT:


- 4 beneficiaries cancelled their appointments (this does not include those who cancelled but reschedule their session for another day)
- 10 beneficiaries did not show up for their appointment (i.e., no prior notice was given)

Only 1 of the beneficiaries who disengaged had already sought services at the clinic, the remaining beneficiaries all disengaged prior to their first appointment.

The sociodemographic information displayed below corresponds to the total number of beneficiaries served at the clinic.


DISTRIBUTION OF SEX:






AGE DISTRIBUTION

The mean age of beneficiaries was 27.72 years old, and the majority of beneficiaries were between the ages 18 and 34.




DISTRIBUTION OF NATIONALITY:






INCOME STATUS:



Score Interpretation Guide


- 1. **PHQ-9**: a validated instrument for measuring the severity of depression.

 <u>Interpretation</u>: 0-4 "None/Minimal", 5-9 "Mild", 10-14 "Moderate", 15-19 "Moderately Severe", 20-27 "Severe"
- 2. **GAD-7**: a validated instrument for measuring the severity of anxiety.

 <u>Interpretation:</u> 0-4 "None/Minimal", 5-9 "Mild", 10-14 "Moderately Severe", 15-21 "Severe"
- 3. **TSQ**: a brief trauma questionnaire used to predict a PTSD diagnosis. <u>Interpretation:</u> excellent prediction of a PTSD diagnosis when respondents endorse at least six items in the questionnaire.





CHANGE IN MENTAL HEALTH SURVEY SCORES OVER TIME:



Note that sample sizes are not consistent across timepoints and that beneficiaries do not fill in the mental health survey at every session attended, rather the surveys are administered every 2-3 appointments.

PSYCHOSOCIAL ASSESSMENTS:

A total of 9 beneficiaries were referred to the social worker who conducted extensive psychosocial assessments. Of those beneficiaries, 5 (55.55%) were females, 6 (66.66%) were single, and their average age was 27.66 years old. The overwhelming majority of them (77.77%) resided in Mount Lebanon and the remaining resided in Beirut. All 9 of the beneficiaries required mental health services and most of them were categorized as "low urgency" (44.44%), followed by "medium urgency" (33.33%) and "high urgency" (22.22%). Most of the beneficiaries were referred to an in-house mental health service provider (66.66%), 1 beneficiary was directed to the Embrace Lifeline, and the rest were referred to different NGOs. 6 of the cases 9 cases initiated in November are still ongoing and the remaining 3 have been resolved. Finally, 7 cases from previous months were also resolved in the month of November.
